## QUADRILLE AND PAS DE DEUX PLANNED FOR FUN AND TRAINING IN 2009

Mounted drill has been used for centuries to train both horse and rider. The military used drill to teach horse and rider to work together as a unit as well as in mass. Drill used the horse's herd instinct to overcome fear and move as one on the battlefield. Dressage has continued this military aspect of training for both horse and rider with Quadrille and Pas De Deux classes.

Just as drill helps horse and rider work together with others in the unit, these dressage classes help a rider use all the things learned in lessons and make it "automatic" in the body as the mind is thinking about the music and what the other rider is doing. Also, horses can often feel more relaxed in a group atmosphere and in fact learn the "drill" faster than the riders do!

Many members of CDCTS have expressed an interest in training mounted drill as a way to have fun while

training and enjoy the camaraderie of a group of like minded riders. This training will start as fun for all of us but perhaps will become an additional class at shows for our members. If you have ever seen the Royal Canadian Mounted Police Musical Ride you know the training the horse and rider must go through. You can see their musical ride on [www.youtube.com](http://www.youtube.com) just search RCMP Musical Ride. There was also quite a few pas de deux and quadrille rides to view as well.

December 2008 Meeting Minutes

December 8, 2008

President Rita Dunn brought the meeting to order, where the following business was conducted:

### Old Business

Secretary's Report: None for this month, as the Secretary was unable to attend this meeting.

Treasurer's Report: The Treasurer's Report was read and approved. One CD is coming due this month; unanimous approval to renew it.

Symposium Committee Report: Yvonne Barteau is now scheduled for October 10-11, 2009. She will charge \$850.00/day and is willing to take 8-9 riders per day. Board requested that a Contract to engage Yvonne Barteau be drafted as soon as possible; Esther Roberts volunteered to draft the contract. The Board decided to hold off on applying for a USDF grant for this clinic, based upon the expectation that enough auditors will attend the Barteau symposium to cover the entire cost of the symposium and that a wiser course of action is to wait for a higher-cost clinic to submit a grant request to USDF. A possible future clinician mentioned was Thomas Ritter.

Banquet Committee Report: Silent Auction items are needed as soon as possible so preparations can be completed for this aspect of the banquet. The banquet will be held at Sullivan's in Maryville; we have reserved the upstairs and balcony areas for our banquet.

Spring Show Committee: Laura Wolfe will be our judge; her contract has been executed. Ribbons have been ordered for both the Spring and Autumn shows, as we save on shipping costs if we place a combined order. The venue will be Penrose Farm. Spring Show Date: May 9, 2009.

### New Business

Proposed USDF Fee Increases. Nell Walton is coordinating a response from CDCTS to the USDF regarding the proposed fee increases. There was much discussion over the current fees versus proposed fees, how it will affect membership, participation, etc. The Board made a request to all members to please respond to Nell by December 15. Nell and Rita will draft the final, collective CDCTS reply to USDF.

Bake sale snafu. Regarding the misunderstanding between CDCTS and Maryville High School's Equestrian Team at the schooling show: CDCTS gave a check for \$100.00 to MHS's Equestrian Team to show a good-faith effort to resolve the misunderstanding and repair any relationship damage. MHS has provided no response to CDCTS to acknowledge receipt of the check, although the check has cleared our account. Carol Grau volunteered to follow-up with MHS.

New Meeting Venue. Susan Price has contacted the Courtyard Café, located on Alcoa Highway just south of the Pellissippi (I-140) exchange). They have a private room and have agreed to waive the usual reservation fee for this room, given the expectation that at least 15 people attend our monthly meeting. We will hold our February meeting at the Courtyard Café and, unless anyone has strong objections, plan to hold our monthly meeting there for the foreseeable future.

The meeting adjourned and members enjoyed a wonderful holiday feast, delightful fellowship, and festive holiday games, all in the warm and welcoming atmosphere of the Price's lovely new home. ## "Wonderful Waltzing Walkers" a huge hit at NWA Annual Convention

CDCTS member Esther Roberts presented a lecture-style clinic on musical freestyles for gaited horses during the National Walking Horse Association (NWA) Annual Convention last month. Here's an update from Esther:

"The response was amazing! The members of NWA were so excited about the possibilities of adding musical freestyles to the dressage classes of their versatility division. The NWA Versatility Committee invited me to join their meeting the first night of the Convention. The Versatility Committee has the challenging job of establishing rules for each discipline covered by the term, 'versatility.' This includes dressage, hunter/jumper, driving, competitive trail riding, endurance riding, halter showmanship, and various western disciplines such as pole bending, reining, barrel racing, trail and pleasure.

NWA makes a conscious effort to model the rules for each versatility discipline after the various 'traditional horse' (walk/trot/canter) rules, thus NWA's dressage rules directly parallel USDF/USEF rules, with limited exceptions to accommodate certain aspects of NWA show rules and to encourage members to participate in versatility disciplines. For example, NWA dressage introductory classes allow exhibitors to show in a cut-back saddle and saddle seat attire. This encourages gaited horse owners to enter the world of dressage without having to buy a dressage saddle and traditional dressage attire first. Exhibitors performing higher level tests are expected to use a dressage saddle and wear traditional dressage attire.

The NWA folks who ride and show dressage are a dedicated, enthusiastic group. They were very engaged throughout the freestyle presentation and several NWA members made preliminary plans for me to work with them and create freestyles for the 2009 show season.

Despite the various differences between the gaited horse and traditional horse communities, one universal truth remains: we are all committed to developing a working partnership with our horse(s) based upon mutual trust, respect, and understanding. I was honored to be a clinician at the 2008 NWA convention and I look forward to working with NWA to develop musical freestyles for the gaited horse."

### *Forget the "A" Train!*

For many riders, one of the most challenging aspects of performing an outstanding freestyle ride is learning to disregard the arena letters. Unlike a test, where accurate transitions generally occur at a letter or between two letters, freestyle transitions should always occur simultaneously with the corresponding edit in your freestyle music.

Sometimes an element is choreographed to start at a letter, but choreographing a required element in an unusual location within the ring can help eliminate any "test-like" feel to your freestyle. "Off-the-letter" elements, however, force the rider to rely solely on the music to cue the transition. Even "on-the-letter" elements require careful listening during each perform-
