

CDCTS 2012 General Rules For Dressage and Combined Test Awards

- ❖ Adult Amateur or JR/YR status **MUST** be stated on the front of the score sheet or it will otherwise be considered Open.
- ❖ Awards are based on percentage (dressage), or low score (combined tests); not the position placing in the class.
- ❖ Each rider must be a member of CDCTS prior to the time of the show in order to be eligible for year-end awards.
- ❖ **For RECOGNIZED SHOWS (Dressage or Events / Horse Trials): A horse and rider combination must submit at least 3 scores for the award level. The scores submitted must originate from 2 different judges and can result from one or more shows. At least 1 score must be derived from the highest test of that level.**
- ❖ **For SCHOOLING SHOWS (Dressage or Combined Training): A horse and rider combination must submit at least 3 scores from 2 different judges for the award level. The scores must be attained from at least two shows. At least 1 score must be derived from the highest test of that level.**
- ❖ Year end awards placings shall be based on the average of the scores submitted by each horse and rider combination at each level and division.
- ❖ Horse and rider combinations showing at more than one level during the awards year will only be eligible for awards at one level. **Please choose which level you would like to be eligible for awards, and only submit scores for that level.** If scores are submitted for more than one level, only those scores earned at the highest level will be considered for year-end awards purposes.
- ❖ Horse and rider combinations are not eligible to win an award at the same level in consecutive or subsequent years **with the exception of the FEI levels (Prix St-Georges through Grand Prix)** which will allow eligibility to win an award at the same level more than one time in consecutive or subsequent years.
- ❖ Only scores from the current competition year (December 1 – November 30) will count towards year-end awards.
- ❖ **A minimum of 4 volunteer hours must be completed during the current competition year (December 1 – November 30) in order to be eligible for year-end awards.** All riders are responsible for submitting their volunteer hour logs along with their scores at the end of the competition year. Volunteer hour logs must be dated and signed by the volunteer coordinator of the event(s) in which the hours were worked.
- ❖ All riders are responsible for mailing in copies of their tests or having the show secretary sign off on the official CDCTS score sheets at shows where the score sheets are present. Original tests will not be returned. Photo copies of tests must be received by Linda Klingerman by **November 1**

of the competition year, and copies **MUST SHOW THAT THE TESTS WERE SIGNED BY THE JUDGES.**

For **Recognized Shows**, one award will be available in each division (AA, Jr/Yr, and Open) for each level listed above *with the exception of Intro Level*. Minimum qualifying scores apply. **For RECOGNIZED SHOWS (Dressage): a horse and rider combination must submit at least 3 scores from 2 different judges which can be from one show with at least 1 score derived from the highest test of that level.**

For **Schooling Shows**, one award will be available in each division (AA, Jr/Yr, and Open) for each level from Intro through Second Level. One award will be available in each division for Third Level and above COMBINED. One award will also be available in each division for Musical Freestyles of ALL LEVELS COMBINED. Minimum qualifying scores apply. **For SCHOOLING SHOWS (Dressage): a horse and rider combination must submit at least 3 scores from 2 different judges from 2 different shows with at least 1 score derived from the highest test of that level.**

- ❖ A horse and rider pair is only eligible to earn awards at one level per year with the exception of the FEI levels (Prix St. Georges through Grand Prix) which will allow eligibility to win an award at the same level more than one time in consecutive or subsequent years. A horse and rider pair competing for a musical freestyle award will maintain eligibility to earn an award at the same level they have submitted their general test scores.

- ❖ The Jack Foster High Point Dressage Award will be awarded to the high point of the year for schooling shows only, Training Level and above.

- ❖ One Best Average Score award will be available in each division listed above.
- ❖ One Overall Best Score award will be given out to the best overall score from all divisions.
- ❖ A horse and rider pair is only eligible to earn awards at one level per year.
- ❖ There are no minimum qualifying score requirements for Combined Tests.
- ❖ **For SCHOOLING SHOWS (Combined Training): a horse and rider combination must submit at least 3 scores from 2 different judges from 2 different shows with at least 1 score derived from the highest test of that level.**
- ❖ **RECOGNIZED SHOWS (Events / Horse Trials): a horse and rider combination must submit at least 3 scores from 2 different judges with at least 1 score derived from the highest test of that level which can be from one show.**
- ❖ The Laurel Ann Crowe Perpetual Trophy will be awarded to the best score of the year for schooling shows only.
